This Addendum forms a part of the Contract Documents and modifies the original Contract Documents dated April, 2016. Acknowledge receipt of this Addendum in the space provided on the Bid Proposal form. Failure to do so may subject the Bidder to disqualification.

### **CHANGES/CLARIFICATIONS TO THE BIDDING REQUIREMENTS:**

1. **Section 00 41 43, BID FORM**

The "Bid Form" has been revised to reflect the following changes:

- A) Removal of ODOT Item 441 Asphalt Concrete Intermediate Type 2 (448). This item will now be provided by the Ohio Department of Transportation along with the Surface Course.
- B) Additional adjustment of quantities based on information contained in this Addendum and clarifications requested by Planholders.

A "Revised Bid Form" is attached to this Addendum and shall become part of the Bid Package. Please insure that receipt of this Addendum is noted on your bidding documents. Bidders will be allowed to utilize an Excel spreadsheet with submittal of their bid packet, if desired, but it must include all of the documentation shown on the Revised Bid Form.

3. **Section 00 71 00, GENERAL PROVISIONS (CDBG)**

Page 1 of 21, Definitions & Terms Section 1, Item #2., may indicates the Owner is the "Village of New Madison". This shall be changed to read "Village of Ansonia".

4. **Section 00 73 52, WAGE DETERMINATION SCHEDULE**

The "Wage Determination Schedule" dated 03/18/2016 with 5 Modifications has changed. A new "Wage Determination Schedule" dated 04/08/2016 with 7 Modifications is attached.

CHANGES/CLARIFICATIONS TO THE DETAIL CONSTRUCTION PLANS:

5. Sheet #2 of #23 – Typical Section

*Repair of Existing Field Tile or Storm Drain Detail* – Fernco couplings with stainless steel bands shall be “non-shear” type.

*Typical Street Section* – Item #3 shown as “Item 441 - 1 ½” Asphalt Concrete Intermediate Course Type 2 (448)” shall be changed to be provided “by others”. The Asphalt Concrete Surface Course, Tack Coat and Asphalt Concrete Intermediate Course will all be provided by the Ohio Department of Transportation.

6. Sheet #3 of #23 – Storm Sewer Details

*Yard Drain, As Per Plan* – In addition to the Detail shown, add a concrete collar around the 90 degree bend.

7. Sheet #4 of #23 – Storm Sewer Details

*Fire Hydrant Detail* – Add 8 C.F. of washed aggregate ODOT #57 pit beneath each hydrant for adequate draining. All hydrants shall also include a 5 ¼” storz connection.

*Tracer Wire Detail* – The tracer wire shall be installed plumb and level.

*Typical Gate Valve Detail for 3” –12” Valves* – See attached Detail to this Addendum to be added as Sheet 4B of 23.

*Water Service Detail* – The Village of Ansonia requires Mueller corporation and curb stops to match their current standard. The tap saddle shall be designed and approved for C-900 water line pipe. The water service K copper pipe shall be extended to the right-of-way and connected to the user service water line unless otherwise directed by the Village, The Village will retain removed curb box and lids as part of their inventory.

8. Sheet #5 of #23 – Typical Details

*Typical Concrete Drive Detail* – Drive thickness in Section A-A: Item 452 is called out as 7” Non-Reinforced Concrete Pavement. This is correct for all residential driveways. However, for alley aprons and commercial driveway aprons, the thickness provided shall be 8” of Item 452 Non-Reinforced Concrete.

9. Sheet #6 of #23 – General Notes

*Note #15* – Item 614 Maintaining Traffic – The ODOT Contact for coordinating the State Route 47 detour is Sam Sine (937-497-6891). The Contractor shall contact Mr. Sine to arrange for detour. Proper notification time shall be given in accordance with ODOT requirements The Contractor shall be responsible for all permits and associated costs with detour and maintaining traffic.

*Note #46* – Testing – For clarification of the testing requirements, not the following: 1) Subgrade compaction testing shall be completed per Note #16 of Sheet 6 of 23; 2) Aggregate base testing shall be completed per Note #38 on Sheet 6 of 23; 3) Pie deflection/mandrel testing for storm

sewer is not required; 4) The Owner will pay for additional asphalt testing other than that shown on indicated in the Contract Documents; 5) Trench backfill testing shall be incorporated under Subgrade Compaction & Aggregate Base testing as noted above; Concrete testing shall be provided as follows:

### **Concrete Testing**

#### **A. General:**

1. The Contractor shall engage and pay for the required routine concrete testing of materials unless otherwise noted on the plans. The Contractor shall hire and pay for any additional tests to guarantee his performance of work. The Contractor shall coordinate this work with the testing company and engineer.
2. Any field and laboratory testing costs incurred because of changes in the concrete mix ingredients or proportions of the concrete mix or materials which fail to meet specifications shall be at the Contractors expense.
3. Conduct test samples at site in accordance with:
  - a. Slump ASTM C143.
  - b. Air Entrainment ASTM C231
  - c. Compressive Strength Test: ASTM C31 and C39.

#### **B. Tests and Responsibilities:**

1. Objective: Test all materials for compliance with the specifications. Provide concrete mix designs as specified under "Proportions of Concrete Mixes."
2. Secure necessary specimens at ready-mix plants for compliance of specifications.
3. Conduct proper strength tests. Tests to be made for each 50 cubic yards or fraction thereof for any class of concrete placed on any day, except in no case shall any class be less than 1 set of tests. (For sidewalk and curb and gutter pours)

#### **C. Test as follows:**

1. Specimens are required for ASTM C31 "Methods of Making and Curing Concrete Compression and Flexure Specimens in the Field" and cure under standard moisture and temperature conditions.
2. Test specimens-two sets, two specimens for seven day test and two specimens for twenty-eight day tests. Made in conformance with ASTM C39 "Method of Tests for Compressive Strength of Molded Concrete Cylinders."
3. Entrained air tests in accordance with ASTM C173 "Methods of Test of Air Content of Freshly Mixed Concrete by the Volumetric Method," or ASTM C231 "Method of Air Test of Air Content of Freshly Mixed Concrete by the same Pressure Method."
4. Temperature of concrete samples, air temperature at site, and slump shall be determined and recorded.
5. Report all test results in writing to Engineer the same day of tests.
6. Report for strength tests shall contain the date of placement, date of test, job, W/C ratio, mix proportions, slump, location of batch, type of concrete and breaking strength in PSI and type of break, air and concrete temperature.
7. The Contractor shall make arrangements for completion of quality tests. The results of tests and use of testing equipment shall in no way relieve the Contractor of his responsibility to furnish materials and work in full compliance with the drawings and specifications.

- D. Test results:
1. In all cases where the average strength of the laboratory control cylinders shown by these tests for any portion of the structure fall below the minimum ultimate compressive strengths called for, the Engineer shall have the right to order 1) a change in the mix 2) a change in the water content or 3) additional cement at no extra cost to the Owner for the remaining portion of the structure. Test results shall be reported in writing to the Engineer and the Contractor on the same day that tests are made. Report of compressive strength tests shall contain the project identification name and number, date of concrete placement, name of Contractor, name of concrete supplier and truck number, name of concrete testing service, concrete type and class, location of concrete batch in the structure design, compressive strength at twenty-eight (28) days, concrete mix proportions and materials compressive breaking strength, and type of break for both 7-day test, and 28-day tests. Furnish three (3) copies of each test.
  2. Standard cylinder samples (4) must be taken before addition of water. The method of measuring water and the person(s) authorized to add water and make samples must be mutually responsible for cost of additional sampling and testing costs related to discharging concrete in conflict with Contract Documents. All concrete requiring a slump change of more than 2", except when the HRWR admixture is being used, will be rejected.
  3. When concrete fails to meet the acceptance criteria specified in ACI 301, Section 17.2, the Engineer may order further testing of concrete in place in accordance with Section 17.3. When such tests are ordered, cost of testing shall be paid by the Contractor. The Contractor shall bear all cost of correcting rejected work, including the cost of the Engineer's additional services thereby made necessary.

*Add Note #51* - Coordination with the ODOT Safe Routes to School Contract – The Contractor shall coordinate work with the selected Safe Routes to School Contractor. The Safe Routes to School Contractor shall provide sidewalks on the north side of East Canal Street as well as a small section on the south side of East Canal Street east of Fourth Street at approximate Station 28+50 to Station 30+00.

*Add Note #52* – The Contractor shall pothole and locate all water main lines that intersect and/or connect into the new water mains prior to setting alignment or grade and prior to cutting pavement for proposed trench locations.

10. Sheet #8 of #23 – Plan and Profile

- A) Remove and replace an additional 7 L.F. of curb and gutter at the southeast corner of Main & Canal Streets. Also remove and replace section of existing concrete behind the 7 L.F. of curb and gutter.
- B) The fire hydrant at the northwest corner of East Canal Street and Miller Street shall be moved east approximately 2.5' to allow for placement of the south sidewalk leading to the crosswalk.
- C) The location of the water service shown for 111 East Canal Street is incorrect. The correct location is at approximate Station 11+50.
- D) Add a new ¾" water service to 201 North Main Street at approximate Station 10+80.

- E) The water service for 112 East Canal Street is shown in the wrong location. The correct location is at approximate Station 11+54.

11. Sheet #9 of #23 – Plan and Profile

- A) A new water service shall be installed for the lot located at 232 East Canal Street. The exact location will be determined by the Owner.

12. Sheet #11 of #23 – Plan and Profile

- A) The exact location and configuration of the existing 6” water line to the school at Station 29+75 is unknown. The Contractor shall excavate and verify the existing conditions prior to installation of new water main piping.
- B) Driveway approaches to 523 and 529 East Canal Street shall be combined into one extended rive approach. The driveway width at 529 East Canal Street shall also be extended in width approximately 5 feet to the east. The overall drive width for 523 and 529 East Canal Street without 45 degree flairs will be approximately 36 feet wide.

13. Sheet #18 of #23 – Alt - Plan and Profile Sta. 34+00-40+00

- A) The tee for the relocated fire hydrant and valve shall be 8x8x6 with a 6” valve and box provided for the hydrant relocation. This is changed from the 8x8x8 tee as shown on the plans.

**ARTICLE 1 - BID RECIPIENT**

- 1.01 This Bid is submitted to: **[Village of Ansonia, 202 North Main Street, Ansonia, Ohio 45303]**
- 1.02 The undersigned Bidder proposes and agrees, if this Bid is accepted, to enter into an Agreement with Owner in the form included in the Bidding Documents to perform all Work as specified or indicated in the Bidding Documents for the prices and within the times indicated in this Bid and in accordance with the other terms and conditions of the Bidding Documents.

**ARTICLE 2 - BIDDER'S ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS**

- 2.01 Bidder accepts all of the terms and conditions of the Instructions to Bidders, including without limitation those dealing with the disposition of Bid security. This Bid will remain subject to acceptance for 60 days after the Bid opening, or for such longer period of time that Bidder may agree to in writing upon request of Owner.

**ARTICLE 3 - BIDDER'S REPRESENTATIONS**

3.01 In submitting this Bid, Bidder represents that:

- A. Bidder has examined and carefully studied the Bidding Documents, and any data and reference items identified in the Bidding Documents, and hereby acknowledges receipt of the following Addenda:

- B. Bidder has visited the Site, conducted a thorough, alert visual examination of the Site and adjacent areas, and become familiar with and satisfied itself as to the general, local, and Site conditions that may affect cost, progress, and performance of the Work.
- C. Bidder is familiar with and has satisfied itself as to all Laws and Regulations that may affect cost, progress, and performance of the Work.
- D. Bidder has carefully studied all: (1) reports of explorations and tests of subsurface conditions at or adjacent to the Site and all drawings of physical conditions relating to existing surface or subsurface structures at the Site that have been identified in the Supplementary Conditions, especially with respect to Technical Data in such reports and drawings, and (2) reports and drawings relating to Hazardous Environmental Conditions, if any, at or adjacent to the Site that have been identified in the Supplementary Conditions, especially with respect to Technical Data in such reports and drawings.
- E. Bidder has considered the information known to Bidder itself; information commonly known to contractors doing business in the locality of the Site; information and observations obtained from visits to the Site; the Bidding Documents; and any Site-related reports and drawings identified in the Bidding Documents, with respect to the effect of such information, observations, and documents on (1) the cost, progress, and performance of the Work; (2) the means, methods,

techniques, sequences, and procedures of construction to be employed by Bidder; and (3) Bidder's safety precautions and programs.

- F. Bidder agrees, based on the information and observations referred to in the preceding paragraph, that no further examinations, investigations, explorations, tests, studies, or data are necessary for the determination of this Bid for performance of the Work at the price bid and within the times required, and in accordance with the other terms and conditions of the Bidding Documents.
- G. Bidder is aware of the general nature of work to be performed by Owner and others at the Site that relates to the Work as indicated in the Bidding Documents.
- H. Bidder has given Engineer written notice of all conflicts, errors, ambiguities, or discrepancies that Bidder has discovered in the Bidding Documents, and confirms that the written resolution thereof by Engineer is acceptable to Bidder.
- I. The Bidding Documents are generally sufficient to indicate and convey understanding of all terms and conditions for the performance and furnishing of the Work.
- J. The submission of this Bid constitutes an incontrovertible representation by Bidder that Bidder has complied with every requirement of this Article, and that without exception the Bid and all prices in the Bid are premised upon performing and furnishing the Work required by the Bidding Documents.
- K. Bidder agrees that the contracting authority reserves the right to reject any or all bids, to waive any informalities or irregularities in the bids received, and to accept that bid which is considered lowest and to the best interest of the Owner.

#### **ARTICLE 4 - BIDDER'S CERTIFICATION**

4.01 Bidder certifies that:

- A. This Bid is genuine and not made in the interest of or on behalf of any undisclosed individual or entity and is not submitted in conformity with any collusive agreement or rules of any group, association, organization, or corporation;
- B. Bidder has not directly or indirectly induced or solicited any other Bidder to submit a false or sham Bid;
- C. No person interested in this Proposal is directly or indirectly interested in or connected with any other bid or proposal for the said work and no member of the Darke County Board of Commissioners and/or Village of Ansonia is directly or indirectly interested therein, or in any portion thereof, and he will, if required by the Darke County Board of Commissioners and/or the Village of Ansonia, execute and submit from himself as Principal Contractor and from any Subcontractor, the non-collusion affidavits as provided herein.
- D. Bidder has not solicited or induced any individual or entity to refrain from bidding; and
- E. Bidder has not engaged in corrupt, fraudulent, collusive, or coercive practices in competing for the Contract. For the purposes of this Paragraph 4.01.D:
  - 1. "corrupt practice" means the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting of anything of value likely to influence the action of a public official in the bidding process;
  - 2. "fraudulent practice" means an intentional misrepresentation of facts made (a) to influence the bidding process to the detriment of Owner, (b) to establish bid prices at artificial non-competitive levels, or (c) to deprive Owner of the benefits of free and open competition;

3. "collusive practice" means a scheme or arrangement between two or more Bidders, with or without the knowledge of Owner, a purpose of which is to establish bid prices at artificial, non-competitive levels; and
4. "coercive practice" means harming or threatening to harm, directly or indirectly, persons or their property to influence their participation in the bidding process or affect the execution of the Contract.

**ARTICLE 5 - BASIS OF BID**

- 5.01 Bidder agrees that any item not specifically shown or called out on the plans or within the specifications, but is required to complete the work in place and fully operational, shall be included in the bid item that is most closely associated with that portion of the work.
- 5.02 Bidder will complete the Work in accordance with the Contract Documents for the following price(s) and will contract to do all the work and furnish all the materials called for by said plans and specifications, and in consideration thereof, to accept from the Owner as full payment for the completion of each specified item and any required maintenance thereof as hereinafter provided, for the following prices;

Bidder acknowledges that:

- (1) If this Proposal shall be accepted, Bidder will be prepared to discuss with the Darke County Board of Commissioners and the Village of Ansonia in detail any matters relating to special features and the methods proposed to be followed for the general conduct of the work, that within ten (10) days after "Notice of Award" the Contract Form with the Darke County Board of Commissioners and Village of Ansonia for performance of the work will be completed and Bidder will furnish a Contract Bond in an amount not less than one hundred percent (100%) of the total bid amount, and with sureties subject to the approval of the Darke County Board of Commissioners and Village of Ansonia as a guarantee of the faithful performance of this Contract; and that Bidder will also submit the required insurance policies.

**ARTICLE 6 - TIME OF COMPLETION**

- 6.01 Bidder agrees that the Work will be substantially complete and will be completed and ready for final payment in accordance with Paragraph 15.06 of the General Conditions on or before **August 31, 2016**.
- 6.02 Bidder accepts the provisions of the Agreement as to liquidated damages in the amount of \$1,000.00 for every consecutive day after the stated date in the Notice to Proceed and along with any time extension given per a Change Order and it may be retained from the monies which may be due.

**ARTICLE 7 - ATTACHMENTS TO THIS BID**

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Unlisted classifications needed for work not included within the scope of the classifications listed may be added after award only as provided in the labor standards contract clauses (29CFR 5.5 (a) (1) (ii)).

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The body of each wage determination lists the classification and wage rates that have been found to be prevailing for the

cited type(s) of construction in the area covered by the wage determination. The classifications are listed in alphabetical order of "identifiers" that indicate whether the particular rate is a union rate (current union negotiated rate for local), a survey rate (weighted average rate) or a union average rate (weighted union average rate).

#### Union Rate Identifiers

A four letter classification abbreviation identifier enclosed in dotted lines beginning with characters other than "SU" or "UAVG" denotes that the union classification and rate were prevailing for that classification in the survey. Example: PLUM0198-005 07/01/2014. PLUM is an abbreviation identifier of the union which prevailed in the survey for this classification, which in this example would be Plumbers. 0198 indicates the local union number or district council number where applicable, i.e., Plumbers Local 0198. The next number, 005 in the example, is an internal number used in processing the wage determination. 07/01/2014 is the effective date of the most current negotiated rate, which in this example is July 1, 2014.

Union prevailing wage rates are updated to reflect all rate changes in the collective bargaining agreement (CBA) governing this classification and rate.

#### Survey Rate Identifiers

Classifications listed under the "SU" identifier indicate that no one rate prevailed for this classification in the survey and the published rate is derived by computing a weighted average rate based on all the rates reported in the survey for that classification. As this weighted average rate includes all rates reported in the survey, it may include both union and non-union rates. Example: SULA2012-007 5/13/2014. SU indicates the rates are survey rates based on a weighted average calculation of rates and are not majority rates. LA indicates the State of Louisiana. 2012 is the year of survey on which these classifications and rates are based. The next number, 007 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. 5/13/2014 indicates the survey completion date for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

Survey wage rates are not updated and remain in effect until a new survey is conducted.

#### Union Average Rate Identifiers

Classification(s) listed under the UAVG identifier indicate that no single majority rate prevailed for those classifications; however, 100% of the data reported for the classifications was union data. EXAMPLE: UAVG-OH-0010 08/29/2014. UAVG indicates that the rate is a weighted union average rate. OH indicates the state. The next number, 0010 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. 08/29/2014 indicates the survey completion date

for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

A UAVG rate will be updated once a year, usually in January of each year, to reflect a weighted average of the current negotiated/CBA rate of the union locals from which the rate is based.

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WAGE DETERMINATION APPEALS PROCESS

1.) Has there been an initial decision in the matter? This can be:

- \* an existing published wage determination
- \* a survey underlying a wage determination
- \* a Wage and Hour Division letter setting forth a position on a wage determination matter
- \* a conformance (additional classification and rate) ruling

On survey related matters, initial contact, including requests for summaries of surveys, should be with the Wage and Hour Regional Office for the area in which the survey was conducted because those Regional Offices have responsibility for the Davis-Bacon survey program. If the response from this initial contact is not satisfactory, then the process described in 2.) and 3.) should be followed.

With regard to any other matter not yet ripe for the formal process described here, initial contact should be with the Branch of Construction Wage Determinations. Write to:

2.) If the answer to the question in 1.) is yes, then an interested party (those affected by the action) can request review and reconsideration from the Wage and Hour Administrator (See 29 CFR Part 1.8 and 29 CFR Part 7). Write to:

The request should be accompanied by a full statement of the interested party's position and by any information (wage payment data, project description, area practice material, etc.) that the requestor considers relevant to the issue.

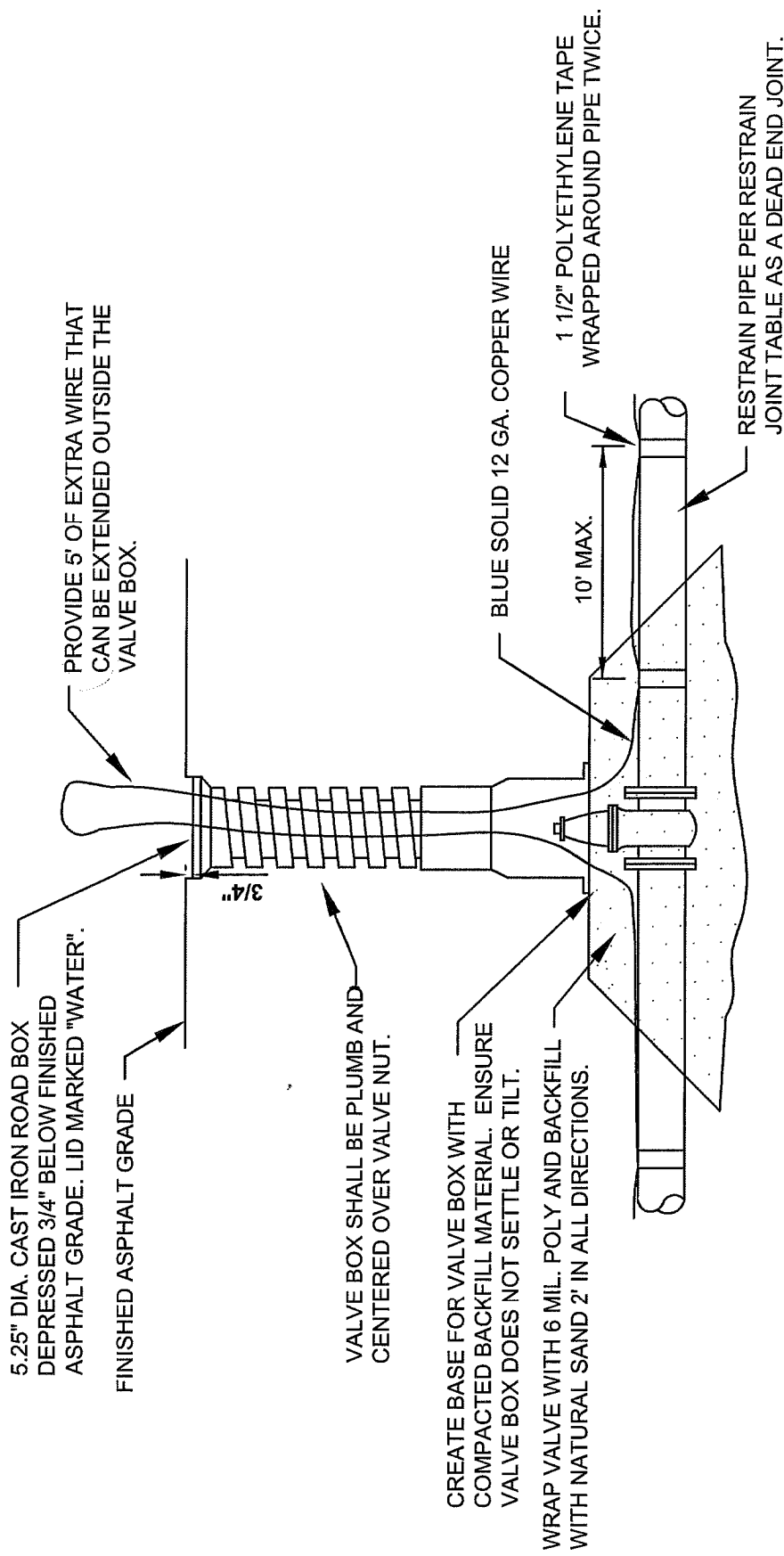
3.) If the decision of the Administrator is not favorable, an interested party may appeal directly to the Administrative Review Board (formerly the Wage Appeals Board). Write to:
