This Bid will remain subject to acceptance for 60 days after the Bid opening, or for such longer period of time that Bidder may agree to in writing upon request of Owner.

ARTICLE 3 - BIDDER'S REPRESENTATIONS

- 3.01 In submitting this Bid, Bidder represents that:
 - A. Bidder has examined and carefully studied the Bidding Documents, and any data and reference items identified therein, and hereby acknowledges receipt of the following Addenda:

- B. Bidder has visited the Site, conducted a thorough, alert visual examination of the Site and adjacent areas, and become familiar with and satisfied itself as to the general, local, and Site conditions that may affect cost, progress, and performance of the Work.
- C. Bidder is familiar with and has satisfied itself as to all Laws and Regulations that may affect cost, progress, and performance of the Work.
- D. Bidder has carefully studied all: (1) reports of explorations and tests of subsurface conditions at or adjacent to the Site and all drawings of physical conditions relating to existing surface or subsurface structures at the Site that have been identified in the Supplementary Conditions, especially any Technical Data in such reports and drawings, and (2) reports and drawings relating to Hazardous Environmental Conditions, if any, at or adjacent to the Site that have been identified in the Supplementary Conditions, especially any Technical Data in such reports and drawings.
- E. Bidder has considered the information known to Bidder itself; information commonly known to contractors doing business in the locality of the Site; information and observations obtained from visits to the Site; the Bidding Documents; and any Site-related reports and drawings identified in the Bidding Documents, with respect to the effect of such information, observations, and documents on (1) the cost, progress, and performance of the Work; (2) the means, methods, techniques, sequences, and procedures of construction to be employed by Bidder; and (3) Bidder's safety precautions and programs.

- F. Bidder agrees, based on the information and observations referred to in the preceding paragraph, that no further examinations, investigations, explorations, tests, studies, or data are necessary for the determination of this Bid for performance of the Work at the price bid and within the times required, and in accordance with the other terms and conditions of the Bidding Documents.
- G. Bidder is aware of the general nature of work to be performed by Owner and others at the Site that relates to the Work as indicated in the Bidding Documents.
- H. Bidder has given Engineer written notice of all conflicts, errors, ambiguities, or discrepancies that Bidder has discovered in the Bidding Documents, and confirms that the written resolution thereof by Engineer is acceptable to Bidder.
- The Bidding Documents are generally sufficient to indicate and convey understanding of all terms and conditions for the performance and furnishing of the Work.
- J. The submission of this Bid constitutes an incontrovertible representation by Bidder that Bidder has complied with every requirement of this Article, and that without exception the Bid and all prices in the Bid are premised upon performing and furnishing the Work as required.
- K. Bidder agrees that the contracting authority reserves the right to reject any or all bids, to waive any informalities or irregularities in the bids received, and to accept that bid which is considered lowest and to the best interest of the Owner.

ARTICLE 4 - BIDDER'S CERTIFICATION

4.01 Bidder certifies that:

- A. This Bid is genuine and not made in the interest of or on behalf of any undisclosed individual or entity and is not submitted in conformity with any collusive agreement or rules of any group, association, organization, or corporation;
- B. Bidder has not directly or indirectly induced or solicited any Bidders to submit a false or sham Bid;
- C. No person interested in this Proposal is directly or indirectly interested in or connected with any other bid or proposal for the said work and no member of the Darke County Board of Commissioners is directly or indirectly interested therein, or in any portion thereof, and he will, if required by the Darke County Board of Commissioners, execute and submit from himself as Principal Contractor and from any Subcontractor, the non-collusion affidavits as provided herein.
- D. Bidder has not solicited or induced any individual or entity to refrain from bidding; and
- E. Bidder has not engaged in corrupt, fraudulent, collusive, or coercive practices in competing for the Contract. For the purposes of this Paragraph 4.01.D:
 - 1. "corrupt practice" means the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting of anything of value likely to influence the action of a public official in the bidding process;
 - "fraudulent practice" means an intentional misrepresentation of facts made (a) to influence the bidding process to the detriment of Owner, (b) to establish bid prices at artificial noncompetitive levels, or (c) to deprive Owner of the benefits of free and open competition;
 - "collusive practice" means a scheme or arrangement between two or more Bidders, with or without the knowledge of Owner, a purpose of which is to establish bid prices at artificial, noncompetitive levels; and
 - 4. "coercive practice" means harming or threatening to harm, directly or indirectly, persons or their property to influence participation in the bidding process or execution of the Contract.

PAVING FABRIC 32 05 20

PART ONE

1.01 General

- A. This document covers general installation of overlay paving fabric for asphalt paved surfaces.
- B. Where contradictions occur, follow the instructions of the Engineer.

PART TWO

2.01 **Equipment**

- A. The overlay fabric can be installed with a mechanical unit that is mounted on the front bucket of a tractor or backhoe.
 - Any mechanical or manual equipment should be capable of laying down the 1.) paving fabric smoothly.
- Required Tools: В.
 - 1.) Stiff bristle brooms or squeegees to smooth the fabric.
 - Scissors or blades to cut the fabric. 2.)
 - Brushes for applying asphalt sealant. 3.)

PART THREE

3.01 **Prepare Surface**

- Thoroughly clean the existing pavement by removing all dirt, water, oil and foreign A. materials.
- B. Cracks with widths greater than 1/8 inch must be filled with an approved crack sealant and all potholes repaired as directed and approved by the Engineer.

PART FOUR

4.01 **Seal & Apply Tack Coat**

- A. Preferred tack coat:
 - Uncut asphalt cement is the preferred tack coat to impregnate, seal and bond the paving fabric to the pavement.
 - Uncut asphalt cement is preferred because it develops adhesive strength a.) in a quicker manner.

Page 1 of 3 **Paving Fabric**

- b.) Cut-back grade asphalt or emulsions which contain solvents are not recommended as tack coat.
- B. Air and pavement temperatures during installation must be at least 50°F and rising for asphaltic cement or 60°F and rising for heavier grade emulsions.
- C. Apply the tack coat at or above the recommended application temperatures of 140°F for asphaltic cement and 160°F for heavier grade emulsions.
 - 1.) The tack coat temperature must not exceed 325°F.
- D. The application rate of the tack coat depends on the porosity of the existing payement.
 - 1.) Apply the tack coat at a distribution range of 0.20 gal/sy to .30 gal/sy.
 - 2.) Use a calibrated distributor truck to assure the specified tack rate.
- E. Apply the tack coat 6 inches wider than the width of the paving fabric rolls.

PART FIVE

5.01 Place Paving Fabric

- A. If emulsions are used, allow any water to evaporate before installing the paving fabric.
- B. Place the fabric with the untreated (fuzzy) side against the existing pavement while the tack coat is still tacky.
 - 1.) Calendared side is facing up.
- C. Make sure fabric is smooth and straight.
- D. Overlapping fabric:
 - 1.) For sharp corners or curves, slice fabric and overlap ends in the direction of the paving operation.
 - 2.) When a transverse joint is required, overlap the fabric 4 to 6 inches in the direction of the paying operation.
 - 3.) Overlap longitudinal joints 2 to 4 inches.
 - 4.) Apply additional tack coat to any joints to insure proper bonding.
- E. After fabric placement, proceed with standard paving operation.

5.02 Notes for Applications over Milled Surfaces

- A. The fabric must be broomed or pneumatically rolled into place.
- B. The surface needs to be clean and dry.
 - 1.) Broom or air blow surface to eliminate dust and cuttings.
- C. Apply tack coat 10% to 15% heavier than a standard overlay application.
 - 1.) If site conditions require milling deeper than the minimum necessary to remove surface ruts, AC thickness may need to be increased more than 15%.

Paving Fabric

- D. Place a minimum of 1.25 inches compacted asphalt overlay on all surfaces including the curb areas.
- E. If milling has penetrated areas below the asphalt surface, these areas should be restored with hot mix asphalt.
 - 1.) If surface has deeper grooves with near vertical faces, sharp or vertical edges, faulted joints, etc., place a dense grade hot mix asphalt leveling course before application of paving fabric.

PART SIX

6.01 Storage

- A. Paving fabric rolls are wrapped in a UV protective cover.
- B. If stored outdoors for a prolonged period, elevate the overlay fabric from the ground and cover with a tarpaulin or opaque plastic.
 - 1.) Contractor must insure rolls are adequately protected from:
 - a.) Moisture.
 - b.) Ultraviolet radiation.
 - c.) Chemicals that are strong acids or bases.
 - d.) Temperatures in excess of 140°F.
 - e.) Animal destruction.

PART SEVEN


7.01 Acceptable Material

- A. Geotextile like Tensar GlasPave 25, meets or exceeds standard of AASHTO T283-07 and ASTM D7239, or approved equal.
- B. Install in strict accordance with manufacturer's written installation instructions.
- C. Submit Technical Data Sheet for Owner's and Engineer's approval prior to placement.
